Orbit 	The path of an object around a particular point in space.
Mission 	Sending people or machines into Space to visit other planets or research.
Space 	The area that contains the entire universe beyond the Earth.
NASA	The federal agency in charge of sending people to space.
Gravity 	An invisible force that pulls objects towards each other.
Solar System 	The sun and everything that orbits around the sun.
International Space Station (ISS)	The biggest object ever flown into space.
