TOPIC: THE FLINTSTONES

<p><u>Knowledge:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The Stone Age started around 800,000 BC, the Bronze Age started around 2,100 BC and the Iron Age started around 750 BC. The Stone Age was when humans used stones to create weapons and tools, they used bronze in the Bronze Age and iron in the Iron Age. Some early settlements from these 3 ages include Boxgrove near Chichester, Cissbury Ring, Skara Brae and Stonehenge. In the Stone Age, people had to hunt, fish and gather their food. They used tools like spears, bows and arrows. Stone Age men and women were not able to write and communicated through gestures and signals. Archaeologists help us to understand what life was like in the past. 		<p><u>Skills:</u></p> <p>History:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know how Stone Age people hunted for their food. In this exciting topic, we will be focusing on life in the Stone Age. We will be learning about early settlers, where they came from and where they settled in the UK. We will be learning all about daily life in the Stone Age and how archaeologists have helped us to learn more about this time. In Science we will be learning about Rocks and Soils. We will learn how to group rocks by their appearances and their properties, as well as using new terms such as 'sedimentary' and 'igenous'. We will also be investigating which rocks are most suitable for building. In Art, we will be creating our own cave paintings and in D.T we will be designing and making our own clothing or accessories for a Stone Age baby, through sewing and using a range of textiles. For our music this half-term, we will be starting to learn the recorder. We will also be learning two songs matching our topic: a version of We Will Rock You and the Stone Age Stomp. Our Computing unit for this half-term focusses on creating Powerpoint Presentations.
