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

Attendance

A big thank you to all of our families who make such a big effort to ensure that their children have a '**Smart Start**' each school morning. Learning starts as soon as the bell rings. The first part of the morning is carefully planned and is a very important time for pupils, often practising key skills and picking up on gaps in learning from previous lessons. Being in on time for these tasks helps them settle, focus, and prepare for the rest of the day. Missing this time can mean that children feel rushed, unsettled, or less confident as lessons progress. Over time, these missed learning opportunities can add up and affect both progress and confidence.

New Playground Development

In the Spring term, work will start on the redevelopment of our playground. The existing playground will be resurfaced and new markings added, the existing trim trail will be replaced by three new climbing structures, and a brand new MUGA (multi-use games area) will be built on a section of the field. The MUGA will have an artificial grass surface, allowing it to be used whatever the weather. We will let you know if any alterations need to be made to drop-off and pick-up arrangements at any point.
