Our topic for this half term is called 'All the fun of the Fair!' Our classroom has been transformed into a fairground, complete with funfair games such as 'hook-a-duck', 'tin can alley' and a food stall. We will be making posters and menus to add to our funfair.

We will be reading and exploring the book 'Pyjamarama Funfair' by Michael Leblond to inspire our learning. We will also be learning how to use adjectives to describe the funfair.



This half term we are reviewing all of the letter sounds that we have learnt so far.

We are developing our ability to read **cvcc** words (consonant-vowel-consonant-consonant) i.e. **hunt, milk** and **ccvc** words i.e. **spin, club** (consonant-consonant-vowel-consonant).

We are working on writing the letters correctly and using them in our reading and writing with growing independence.

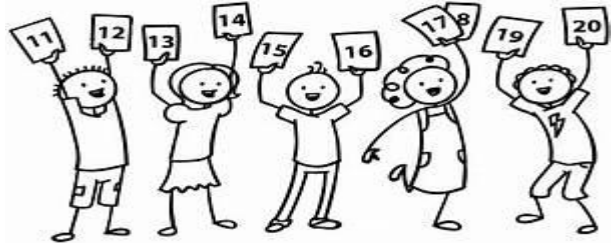

Maths:

In Maths we are looking at the numbers 0-20. In particular saying, recognising and ordering the numbers to 20. We are making sure that we say the 'teen' numbers clearly as we count.
