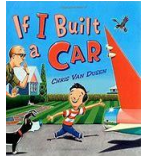
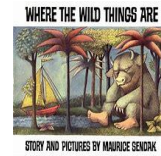




# Foundation Stage News

We are continuing with our 'Journey' topic for the next few weeks.

This week we are reading the book 'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak. In the story, the character of Max travels to 'Wild Island' and becomes the ruler of the Wild Things! However, before long he decides he would rather be back home, safe and sound. We are going to have our own adventure where we will be going on a plane journey to visit 'Wild Island' ourselves!

Next week we are focussing on cars and forms of transport. Our book 'If I built a Car' by Chris Van Dusen will give us ideas to design our own 'dream car'.

In maths we are concentrating on how to represent numbers in different ways and we are learning about one more and one less.

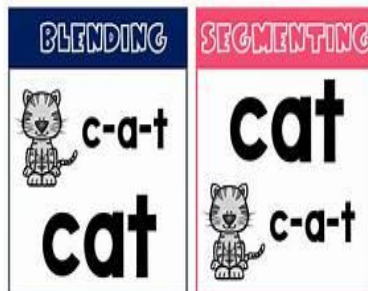


**The phonics we will be learning are:-**

*sh, th, ng, nk, ai, ee, igh, oa*

We are learning that two letters that make one sound are called 'digraphs'. We are also learning that three letters that make one sound are called 'trigraphs'.

We are working on writing the letters correctly and using them in our reading and writing.
