Reading books have now come home with the children. An important part of reading is developing comprehension so we will spend some time working with the children on 'non-worded' books. These type of books are very important in developing reading skills such as predicting (what will happen next?), understanding the characters (how do they feel?) and exploring new vocabulary that can be used in discussion about the books. Please spend time reading and talking about these books with your child - children that experience 'book talk' in their younger years develop into confident readers. Also, please take the opportunity to read the same book several times as this helps to develop understanding and reading with confidence.



Reminders!

Please could every child have a **water bottle** in school. We encourage the children to drink water throughout the day.

Also, please ensure that **everything** is named (including coats, drink bottles, lunch boxes, jumpers....etc!)

Children will need to **come into school in their PE kits** on **Monday's** and **Wednesday's** please.
