
English

We will be reading **Beowulf** by Michael Morpurgo with particular focus on the extensive vocabulary. In keeping with the book, we will



be writing a 'defeat the monster' story. There will be a big focus on writing in a variety of sentence types including using the power of three and the juxtaposition of long and short sentences for effect. As part of our story writing we will look at the grammar requirements for writing speech. We will read a poem on a similar theme called The Malfeasance about a creature that attacks a town.

Maths

Within this half term we will focus on fractions in their many forms with particular emphasis on fractions of a quantity and equivalent fractions. We will then be moving on to decimals and relating tenths and hundredths back to fractions as well as dividing numbers by 10 and 100. Times tables will continue to feature each day as we are nearing the Year 4 tables screening.

In our 'self discipline' topic we will look at how we can improve ourselves through the opportunities that Lent provides. We will look at the sacrifices that Jesus made and relate our understanding to the sacrifices that we can make for others.
